UPDATE: ADA compliances

December 2018 - City Manager Paul Fiser updated City Council on progress on a Compliance Agreement with the Department of the Interior regarding a 2017 complaint about access in parks and recreation areas. The DOI gave the city a two-year period to comply by December 2018 and December 2019.

December 2018:

- Handicap Accessible Portable Toilets in all parks *except* Anderson Depot Plaza.
- Parking improvements completed at Hendricks Park with concrete pad in gravel lot. The pad is not marked but has a sign. Two wheelchair picnic tables are in the pavilion.
- Playgrounds/Equipment: play structures are stated to be accessible for children older than age 5.

"The City will conduct a survey..." and make sure all signs for public spaces and rooms, parks, directional signs, accessible entrance signs, and any bathroom or toilet signs in parks and on the Trail are in compliance by the end of fiscal 2018. One sign in Limerick Park.

December 2019:

Paved access routes to play structures and Community Park swings will be part of the 2019 Paving Plan and completed *before end of 2019*.
"Or the play structures will be removed."

(Other 2019 detailed requirements will be addressed in another issue.



Sundown Town?

(From Front) after sundown (as late as 1980) and after a Charter change against discrimination

"Things haven't changed much," people have told us at TWE..

The 1979 ordinance, on which Council has not taken enforcement action, prohibits discrimination in housing, employment and public accommodation (banks, restaurants, hotels, City buildings, etc.

Until 1980, Blacks could not rent or own property in the city limits or live here unless part of a multi-racial family unit by birth or adoption.

The 1979 law provides for formation of Human Relations Board, established by the Mayor and independent of Council or Administration, to investigate complaints about Discrimination.

In 40 years no mayor has followed the dictates of Charter to establish the HRB and thus housing disputes cannot be resolved - which may explain why 30 years after the law took affect only 37 Blacks lived in the City. Numbers have not changed much 10 years after the census

After being named in a Federal ADA Complaint, the City established a "Grievance Policy" for bringing complaints of disability discrimination - ONLY disability issues.

Discrimination on any other premise- race, age, marital status, education - the usual list - is not covered by the Grievance Policy. However the issues would be covered under the Human Relations Board.
