Second Century begins with murder on national television

MAY 8 - In 1919 Sherwood Anderson published his third book "Winesburg, Ohio" or "life in a small American town". It examined lives and stories of people many thought were from Clyde with secrets or desires on hidden experiences. 2019 marks the hundredth anniversary of publication. Ironically, the first major story of the next 100 years was a national television production about the murder of a Clyde woman who worked at Whirlpool and the man who killed her.
