MSNBC focus: Effect of tariffs on Whirlpool, City

CLYDE and WHIRLPOOL were on MSNBC LIVE national news Wednesday August 1.

"Clyde: population 6,000 Whirlpool: population 3,000" the report begins.

Tariffs on washing machines, steel and aluminum are having heavy effect on the nation's largest washing machine maker. Garret Haake was in town with a camerawoman to explore the tariffs' effects on business, City government, and the people.

Whirlpool was pleased In January when Pres. Trump ordered tariffs on imports of washing machines. But in March tariffs were attached to imports of steel and aluminum.

Haake placed his fingers in the chain-link fence and said "this is the closest we can get to the plant." Employees approached for thoughts told Haake they were told by the Company not to talk to the television company.

"I'll get it!" Private Rodger Young shouted as he ran uphill toward a Japanese machine gun bunker. As he threw a grenade into the nest, he was felled by several shots as the grenade killed all the enemy.

The 'Ballad' was learned and sung by schoolchildren and choirs throughout the hero's FOUR hometowns; He was born in Tiffin, spent his boyhood in Clyde and Green Springs, and enlisted in Fremont (thus Rodger Young Park).

In July 1943 Young was a Sergeant on New Georgia Island in the South Pacific Arena. He requested demotion to Private so he could fight with his men. The unintentional hero was awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor.

While there are statues to other 'hometown heroes' in McPherson Cemetery, there is none to the soldier who ran into the heart of the battle to defend his comrades in the greatest American tradition.

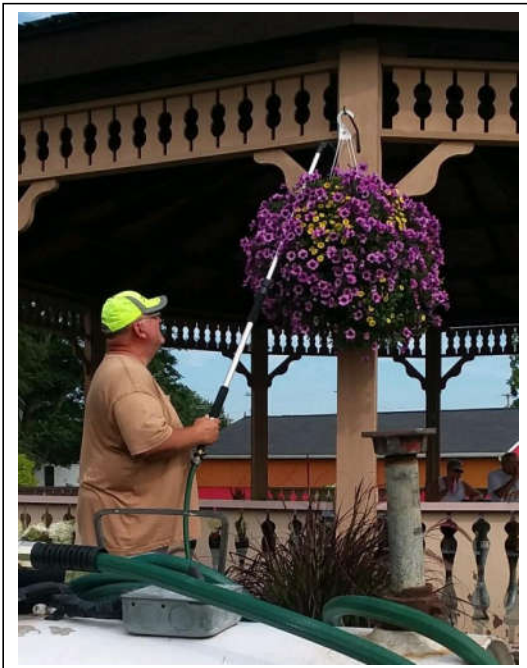

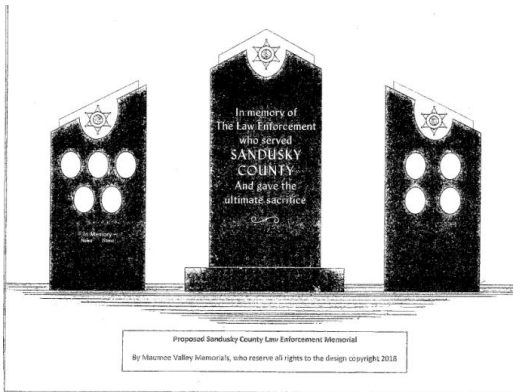
