ELECTION DAY PREVIEW

C-GS levy, City Council on November 5 ballot

Clyde-Green Springs Schools have not passed a levy for operating expenses since 2005. The money maintains programs (**none to athletics***) and covers operating expenses. This will collect \$1 million/year each of five years. Cost to owner of \$100,000 is \$12.25/month. These monies work in our **NeighborGOODS** for the futures of our youths .

C-GS students have gone on to start businesses, teach at all levels from pre-school to college, work at Whirlpool and other industries, lead congregations of many faiths, play professional sports, translate the skills they learn here into worldwide influence.

Brewer, Jackson, Smith, Stanley seek council seats

EDITORS' NOTE. Efforts were made to contact incumbents Jean Jackson and Gary Smith and candidate Brent Stanley. This article, then, will profile each from public actions. Meanwhile, the Editor will present his qualifications and plans.

JOHN BREWER will use his experiences promoting Clyde and Green Springs and C-GS to work FOR Clyde residents, businesses and visitors through wiser use of the Bed Tax and this newspaper with 7,000 readers to build the tourism program; addition of curbs and gutters on 37 miles of streets, restore crosswalks at intersections - beginning with McPherson and Maple which is listed as 2nd most dangerous in Sandusky County The Trail where bikers cross major streets

The Brewers moved to Clyde in 1991. Jan taught in C-GS Schools 18 years.

1. 1991- December 1997, Brewer was **editor** of The Clyde Enterprise (note: The Clyde Enterprise continued 18 years *after* Brewer left to become a **paralegal in Toledo and Federal Courts**).

2. Grantwriter (**downtown benches** as one example).

3. Formed 2 non-profits (Clyde In Bloom; Sherwood Anderson Society.).

4. Asked Council for **new signs** at City Parks, to support **Clyde 160** honoring Railroads that came to "Clyde" in 1852 and Whirlpool which came in 1952.

5. Encourage City Manager to improve accessibility on street AND in all City Parks.

NOTE: new swings in city parks next year is ONE outcome, as well as parking and ramps with signs in City Parks, parking signs on streets.

6. Restore **CIVIL RIGHTS LAW** council abolished this year.

7. **Respect and uphold City Charter**.

8. Continue to monitor commitments made to US Department of the Interior under ADA.
