Schools '*open*' at *home*

SPRING BREAK in Clyde-Green Springs Schools ended March 22 - the First Day of Spring.

LEARNING resumed March 23.

SCHOOLS WERE CLOSED.

"We are conducting OFF-SITE, long distance learning with all students," according to Supt. Dennis Haft.

"The teachers have been instructed to contact all parents at least once a week during this time period and they need to be monitoring assignments and offering feedback.

"For our younger students (grades K-4) we sent them all home with paper and pencil work to complete" Haft added. "We are going to do our best to slowly transition them to technology based learning as well."

In regards to sports, the arts, etc... everything is on hold at this time."

(This would include the CHS Drama's "Beauty and the Beast" April 4-6.)

"We will continue to follow the Governor's mandates to insure we are keeping all as safe as possible," Haft concluded.

Several states, including Indiana, have closed public schools including colleges through May 1. Terra State College closed in keeping with the Governor's STAY IN PLACE order. A few states cancelled the school year.

Sandusky County has First COVID-19 case

A spokeswoman for Sandusky County Health Department confirmed Tuesday the first Corona Virus case.

The report was confirmed on the first full day of Gov. Mike Dewine's **Stay-At-Home**

order through April 6

The Governor previously ordered all public schools in the state to close through April 3.

In the preceding week both Erie County and Huron County reported first deaths.
